Thomas More Virtual Sports Day Monday 6th July 2020




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Maths Challenge

Saint Thomas More

On the 22nd of June was the Feast day of Thomas More, the patron saint of our school. He was an English lawyer, social philosopher, author, statesman, and noted renaissance humanist, who stood for justice all his life. He was martyred for the faith, and for the rights of conscience. Thomas More went to his death for the freedom of religion, and for the rights of the individual against those of the state.

Thomas More stood for justice, let us pray for justice in our world:

O Lord, open my eyes that I may see the needs of others.
Open my ears that I may hear their cries;
Open my heart so that I feel their anguish.
Let me not be afraid to defend the weak, nor afraid to defend the poor.
Show me where love and hope and faith are needed,
and use me to bring them to those places.
Open my eyes and my ears, that I may be able to do some work of peace for thee.
