Trousers - Dark grey school style (boys)

Skirt (girls) - Medium Grey School Style – **knee to mid-calf length**

Tie* - Thomas More Catholic School tie

Shoes - Black leather and polish

Socks/Tights - Dark socks only (boys)

White socks or plain black tights (girls)

Jewellery - No jewellery, except a watch

Hair and Eyebrows - No patterns. No extreme haircuts. No facial hair. Long hair should be either tied back or kept from covering the face with a clip or black Alice band

- Taking part – 1 House Point per person

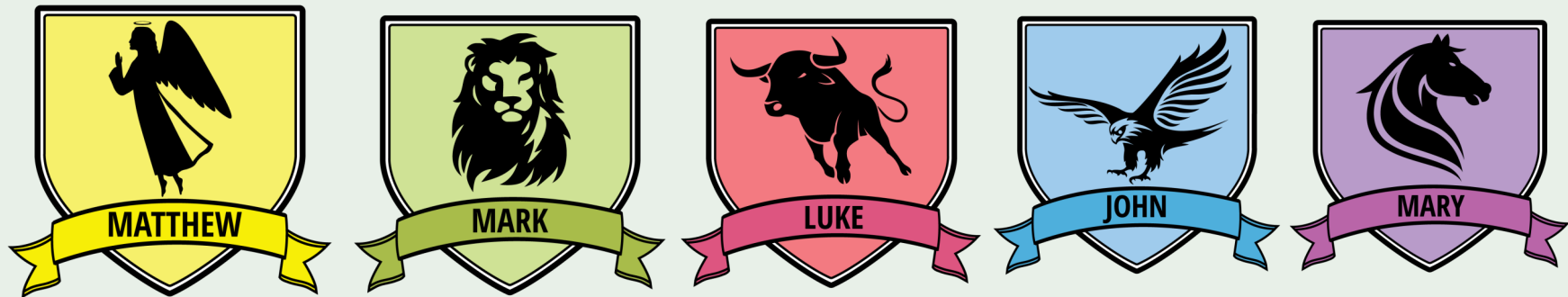
There will be a special reward for high-achieving students and the winning house at the end of the year.
